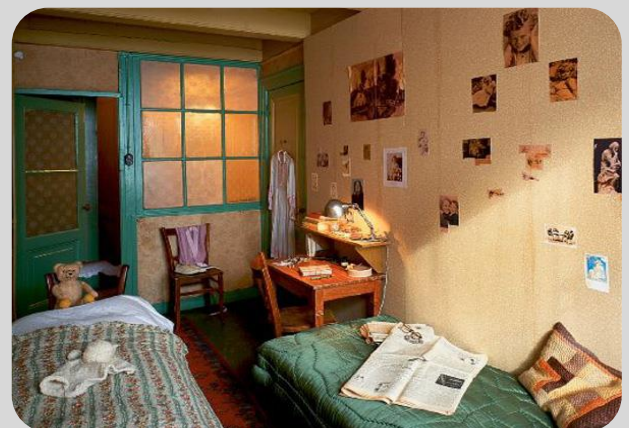
important role, while political power is in the hands of the government and parliament. The cultural traditions of each people are the imprint of their history and identity.

of mashed potatoes with vegetables, usually served with sausage or meat. A traditional dessert made from two thin waffles with a caramel filling is Stroopwafels.
